TOWARDS SUSTAINABLE CITIES ACROSS THE MEDITERRANEAN

The European Union (EU) is leading the global fight against **climate change**, and has made it a top priority. Its ambitious targets are spelt out in the EU Climate Action and Energy Package, which commits Member States to curb their $\rm CO_2$ emissions by 20% by 2020.

The Commission recently proposed the Europe 2020 flagship initiative for a resource efficient Europe and within this framework it is now putting forward a series of long-term policy plans in areas such as transport, energy and climate change. The Roadmap for moving towards a competitive low-carbon economy by 2050 is one of the key building blocks of this flagship initiative.

In this framework, **Cities** are key to the EU's targets and to developing a low carbon economy by 2050, because 70% of the EU's energy is in there consumed. They have a huge potential for energy saving through smarter use of resources and intelligent technology integration.

Local governments must therefore become leading actors for implementing sustainable energy policies, and must be recognized and supported in their effort. The mobilization of local actors/authorities builds on existing, and future EU and national policies and programs, such as the Sustainable Energy Europe (SEE) campaign, CIVITAS, CONCERTO, Intelligent Energy Europe program, Covenant of Mayors and Smart city and communities initiative (SET Plan). Aim of this International Workshop is to present the progress of some of the EU programs on sustainable development mentioned above and to show potential synergies among them for a better implementation in the Mediterranean area.
